

Rationale: The launch of the Multi-Process Alloy Welding (MPAW) Endorsement Challenge Pathway had been delayed until a full review of the proposed practical exam could be completed. This step was taken to ensure the practical exam is aligned to the current program content. Details: The challenge requirements for this program are posted on the ITA website, www.itabc.ca. Applicants must have either a Welder Certificate of Qualification with Interprovincial Red Seal Endorsement or a Welder B Certificate of Qualification with Interprovincial Red Seal Endorsement and 1,350 hours of directly related, documented work experience. Approved applicants must write and pass the ITA Standardized Written Exam before they can proceed with the practical examination. Applicants will be required to provide proof of their written examination mark to the practical assessment venue. Supporting Note: the supporting documents will be supplied directly to the Assessment Documents: Venues and not distributed through the OPSN.
